



Head outdoors and discover your District

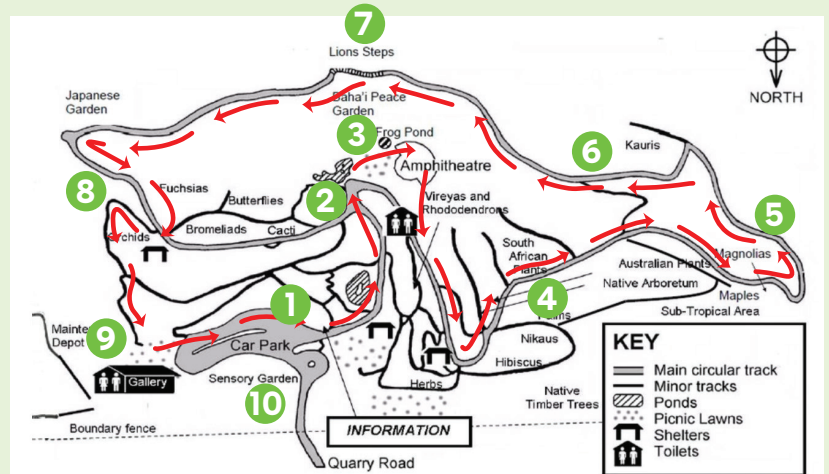
Discover your District Te Puna Quarry Park Loop, Te Puna

Difficulty Moderate level of fitness required. Track is uneven and steep in places. Not suitable in wet conditions. Accessible for dogs on leads.

2km approx. 45min-1.5hrs

Distance

Start the walk from the main car park on Te Puna Quarry Road. Follow the main path in an anticlockwise loop. Question numbers relate to the numbers on the map.



- Who's seat is in the car park?

- Head up the main track, up the hill. What animal is sitting next to the mosaic people?

- Find the frog pond near the amphitheatre. How many species of frog are native to New Zealand?

- Spend some time making music at the Musical Garden. What is your favourite sound?

- Continue up the main track, up the steep hill. There are lots of pine trees planted here. What do they have on their branches?

- Enjoy the wonderful view from the top. Can you see the ocean?

- At the Lions Steps, how high are you above sea level?

- Follow the sign to the car park off the main track. What animal has the bird caught?

- Head down the steps to the wishing well and make wish!
- Join the main track again and walk along side the hall. Make one last stop at the Sensory Garden where you can "Touch, Smell and _ _ _ _" at the plants.

Finish: Hand your completed activity sheet into any Western Bay District Council Library and Service Centre to receive your medal.
